

Terms of Service

When registering for yourself or registering on someone's behalf, you are agreeing to the following Terms of Service and Code of Conduct for the registered attendee and all references to "You" shall apply to the registered attendee. It is your responsibility to ensure the registrant is aware of this agreement.

These terms and conditions ("Terms") govern your registration for and participation in the ASHE Academy ("Event") and constitute an agreement between the American Society for Health Care Engineering (ASHE) of the American Hospital Association (AHA) ("ASHE") and you ("You" or "Your"). You, the registrant, represent to us that you are authorized to enter into these Terms.

Event Registration

You may only register for and attend the Event in accordance with these Terms. To register for the Event, you must complete the Event registration process. Sharing your registration with another person(s) is a violation of the Code of Conduct (as outlined below) and may result in termination of your access to the Event.

Registration Cancellation, Substitution, and No Show Policy

- Cancellation requests must be made in writing to <u>ASHEeducation@aha.org</u> and a cancellation fee of \$100 will be applied.
- Attendee substitutions will be granted.
 - However, changes made 10 days or less before the event, may result in the need to wait for any customized materials (like attendee certificates) to be sent after the event.
- No refunds will be granted for no-shows.
- Payment to join or renew ASHE membership is not refundable.

All refunds will be made using the same method of payment (credit card or check) as the original transaction. Please allow 6-8 weeks for all refunds to be completed.

COVID-19 Safety Protocols

Health care leaders work every day to ensure the safety of their patients and teams, and AHA prioritizes the same goal—your health and safety. AHA, therefore, will require participants attending in-person meetings hosted by AHA or AHA affiliates to be **fully vaccinated** against COVID-19 and will require proof of such vaccination, including for the ASHE Academy. For each event, AHA will provide additional details on safety protocols closer to the event start date.

By registering, you acknowledge that you are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and that you will be required to provide proof of COVID-19 vaccination and also abide by the applicable CDC and local guidelines in order to participate in person at the SHE Academy. If you are not able to show proof of COVID-19 vaccination, you will not be permitted to attend SHE Academy. Should you fail to observe any of our safety protocols, ASHE may remove you from the Event without a refund.
